



Introduction

In September and October 2022, the Witcham Neighbourhood Plan Working Group carried out a comprehensive survey of residents to gather information that would inform the content of the Neighbourhood Plan.


Just under 100 responses were received from those aged over 18 and a further nine responses were received from those aged between 10 and 18.

This document provides the full results of both surveys.

A community feedback event was held in March 2023 when the key results were illustrated along with information about the progress in preparing the Plan.

- 8 Do not understand why Witcham hasn't already applied for a 20mph limit in the village. However, there is really no point in having speed limits at all unless there is some enforcement and a constant threat of enforcement to make sure that they are adhered to. Speedwatch is probably a waste of time, as is further education.....everyone knows that speeding is dangerous in the village, yet the data from the village suggests that many people do not seem to care too much! Speedhumps may help but they make a lot of noise for those near by and they are not very good for the environment due to the slowing down before and speeding up afterwards.
- 9 Speed limit should be reduced on Hive Road to 30 (or 40) to beyond the houses on Hive Road coming down from the village as it is still a 60 which is way too fast given there are several properties on Hive Road with children, horses, dogs and cyclists.
